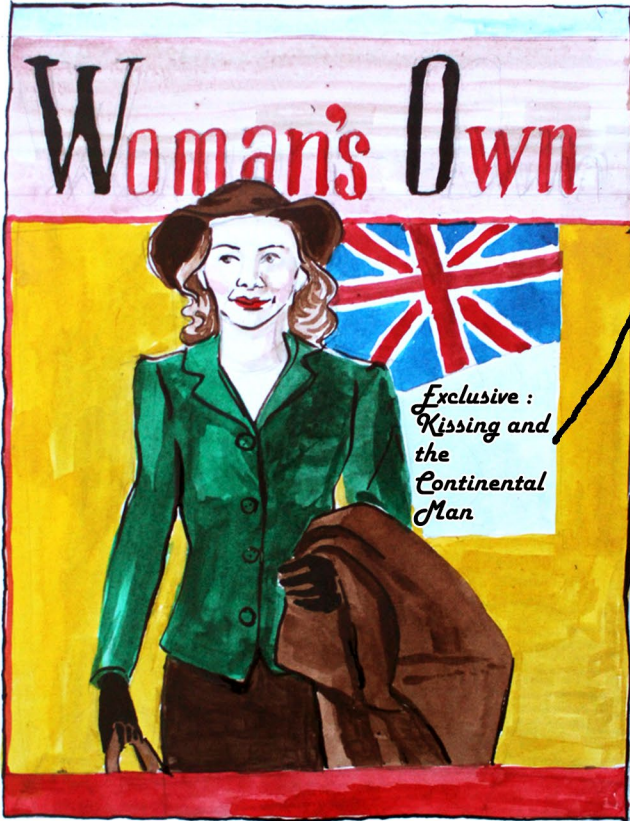


Christine Chilver was busy writing an article for her magazine. It is 1942. She is known for her romantic tone and wit. But who is Christine Chilver- is she really a journalist?
